Dear Mid-Texas Symphony Friends and Family,

On behalf of the Mid-Texas Symphony Society, **THANK YOU** so much for your continued support during this difficult time. Although it has been a long and arduous year, we are excited to announce that we will return to the stage next year!

Starting in January, we will produce four re-imagined concerts for the remainder of the 2020-21 Season. The new 2021 Spring Concert season will provide a live concert experience that can also be live streamed, and the concerts have been re-designed to keep musician and patron safety a priority. With this in mind, all concerts will be one hour without intermission. New concert details and repertoire can be found at the end of this letter.

All four concerts will be on the same dates and the same times you already have on your calendars. **Please note that the January and April concerts in Seguin will now be staged at the Seguin High School Performing Arts Center (1315 E. Cedar St., Seguin, Texas 78155).** The two concerts in New Braunfels will remain at the same locations – the Brauntex Performing Arts Theatre and New Braunfels Civic Convention Center.

If you have already purchased tickets, you will be able to attend the spring concerts in-person at the respective venues. The Box Office will reassign your seats based on social-distancing guidelines and capacity restrictions. If you have tickets but do not want to attend in-person, you will receive a pass to stream the concert at home.

Starting Thursday, December 7th, the Box Office will begin contacting every ticket holder by email (or phone if no email is provided) to review the changes above and to confirm your new assigned seats or to register you to receive a pass to stream the concert at home.

Patrons who will attend the concerts in-person will be given a list of safety protocols that all attendees must adhere to for each concert. The Box Office will provide this list to you, and it will be available on our website in the coming weeks.

No additional tickets to attend the concert in-person will be sold at this time. However, should conditions improve to allow larger venue occupancy, the Mid-Texas Symphony reserves the right to sell additional tickets under the venue's safety guidelines and capacity restrictions.

Streaming passes will be available to the general public. The on-sale date for streaming passes will be announced on a later date.

Please be prepared to receive ongoing communication and announcements about our upcoming Spring Concert Season in the coming weeks.
