Job Title: Education Program Coordinator (Contract)

Location: Remote, with events in Guadalupe and Comal Counties

Compensation: Monthly Retainer

Reports to: Executive Director with some direction from Music Director

Summary:

The Education Coordinator will manage and execute educational programs and events for the Mid-Texas Symphony. This role will encompass planning, event coordination, and post-event follow-up for a series of educational projects aimed at young audiences and community engagement. This is a contract position with compensation divided into monthly retainers.

Key Responsibilities:

- Project Coordination and Management:
 - Young People's Concerts (YPC): Manage logistics, including scheduling, venue setup, and coordination with musicians and staff.
 - Plan and coordinate YPC programs, typically two per season with two 45-minute concerts each.
 - The 2025-26 season dates are
 - September 8, 2025, 9:30 a.m. and 11:00 a.m. at Jackson Auditorium, Seguin, Texas
 - March 23, 2026, 9:30 a.m. and 11:00 a.m. at New Braunfels Civic/Convention Center, New Braunfels, Texas
 - Develop a Teacher's Guide for each program in collaboration with the Music Director and Education Committee and circulate to participating schools in advance of each YPC.
 - Children's Chorus for MTS Holiday Concerts
 - Serve as the main point of contact and coordinator for events involving a children's chorus, typically the annual holiday concert (in 2025-26season, on December 13-14, 2025, at Jackson Auditorium, Seguin, TX).
 - Coordinate rehearsals, performance logistics, and communication between all parties involved including fine arts directors, chorus directors and MTS Librarian.
 - Pre-K Educational Events

- Coordinate small ensemble programs geared toward pre-K children in Comal and Guadalupe Counties. The 2025-26 season includes a story-time program geared toward pre-K children, to be performed up at the following venues: New Braunfels Westside Library, Main New Braunfels Public Library, Bulverde Library, Canyon Lake Library, McKenna Children’s Museum, and Seguin Public Library.
 - Organize chamber ensembles (string quartet or woodwind quintet) to rehearse and perform and coordinate repertoire with the ensemble leader.
 - Manage scheduling, transportation, and event setup at all venues.
 - Second Grade Coloring Book Project
 - In collaboration with the Executive Director, curate, produce, and distribute a coloring book designed for all Second-Grade students in MTS’ service area.
 - Suzuki Side-by-Side Performance
 - Coordinate the Suzuki students' performance at the MTS season finale concert (in 2025-26 season, on April 26, 2026, at Jackson Auditorium, Seguin),
 - Serve as the MTS liaison for the Suzuki teacher.
 - Coordinate rehearsal and performance logistics in collaboration with MTS Production Manager.
- Administrative:
 - Develop and maintain detailed project plans, timelines, and budgets for each event.
 - Coordinate with musicians, educators, and community partners to ensure smooth execution of all projects.
- Event Execution:
 - Oversee the setup and breakdown of events, ensuring all logistical aspects are handled efficiently.
 - Serve as the primary point of contact during events, addressing any issues that arise.
 - Ensure all events run on schedule and meet the organization’s standards for artistic quality and educational value.
- Post-Program Follow-Up:
 - Conduct surveys and collect feedback from participants, educators, and students.
 - Analyze feedback and prepare reports on the success of each event.
 - Implement improvements based on feedback for future events.

Qualifications:

- Interest in a career in music education, arts administration, and/or a related field
- Passion for music education and community engagement
- Experience in event planning and coordination, particularly in educational or musical settings
- Excellent organizational and project management skills
- Strong communication and interpersonal skills with various constituencies, including musicians, volunteers and school administrators, and educators
- Ability to work independently and manage multiple projects simultaneously
- Successful completion of a comprehensive background check
